Residential opportunities for persons with developmental differences are few and far between. Individuals want, and deserve, homes that are safe and comfortable, where they can lead lives of independence and dignity, included as members of the community.

PCR is working to help address this critical need for housing, by developing and building a house that will be home to three women who have developmental differences.

Our partner in this special project is Our Lady of Mercy Parish/Archdiocese of Washington, which made land adjacent to the parish campus available for us to build the house.

We secured significant construction funding from the State of Maryland through Bond Bills enacted by the General Assembly, and from Montgomery County.

Jubilee Association of Maryland, Inc., a Maryland nonprofit organization that is a highly qualified and experienced housing service provider for persons with developmental disabilities, will staff and run the house, providing services to the residents to support their independent, community-based living.
